

Getting to School after the Second World War 1945

I went to Blofield School, I think I was just about seven when I started. I missed the first two years of schooling because of the wartime. We used to go to Blofield School by bus which I think was the 7b, or if it was the 7 we had to get off at The Kings Head. We used to go to Wilkinson's corner, Brundall [Wilkinson's grocery shop was located where Cucumber Lane joins The Street.]

When we were quite young, about seven, we'd be taken to the bus stop by one of the older people but then we used to walk home so we could save the bus money.

We used to walk along 'the turnpike' which was the old A47 [now Yarmouth Road]. Finally I got a bicycle and used to cycle along Cucumber Lane and along the turnpike to Blofield and cycle back.

When walking back we would stop at Witton Run, which is the stream which comes through to Brundall and ends up at the nature reserve. We used to play there quite a while. We used to get told off I suppose when we got home for being late. We used to know all the traffic along the A47 particularly the sugar beet lorries, and the drivers used to wave to us. Blofield School in those days was an all range school and we used to keep pigs and bees and we used to do gardening so it was not just an ordinary little school. Many a time I've gone into the class after cleaning the pigs out. They [the other children] all used to move away!
